"Clues to Your Patients' Health: The Most Prescribed Medications and How They May Impact Your Dental Treatment"

Using commonly prescribed drugs as a starting point, this presentation explores the control of post-operative dental pain, and the antibiotic(s) of choice for oro-facial infections. What is the new FDA warning about codeine and tramadol in children? Why are NSAIDs more appropriate than opioids for treating post-operative dental pain. What are some concerns about NSAID prescribing in the geriatric population? Is antibiotic prophylaxis required for patients with an orthopedic prosthesis? What is antibiotic stewardship and how does it affect me.? Clinically relevant drug interactions with dental medications will be discussed.

At the conclusion of this course, the attendees will know:

- 1. How to minimize prescribing opioids for the control of post-operative dental pain
- 2. How to combine analgesics to maximize their effects.
- 3. Current recommendations for SBE and orthopedic prosthesis prophylaxis (they have changed)
- 4. A practical and useful pharmacologic approach for treating Oro-facial infections
- 5. Medications prescribed for Tardive dyskinesia and how they may interact with dental medications.

"Everything You Wanted to Know About Street/Pharmaceutical Drug Abuse and Their Impact on You, Your Family, and Your Dental Practice"

Opioids, alcohol, and marijuana are the big three in most discussions of substance abuse but what about the consequences associated with vaping, synthetic opioids/cannabinoids (K-2), cathinones (Bath Salts), toad licking, nutmeg, mushrooms, and over the counter (OTC) medications. The hallucinogens, amphetamines, and cocaine derivatives on the street are more potent than ever before. This lecture explores the new threats of substances that can be obtained via the internet, new information on the use/abuse of marijuana, the current climate of our opioid crisis, and their influence on you, your family, and your dental practice. This lecture should be attended by all members of the dental team as well as spouses.

- 1. The signs and symptoms of commonly abused prescription and illicit drugs in patients and adolescents.
- 2. What medications to avoid with the suspected drug abusing patient.
- 3. How to recognize and manage the doctor shopper.
- 4. How to manage the chemically dependent patient.

About the Speaker Harold L. Crossley, D.D.S., M.S., Ph.D. is Professor Emeritus at the University of Maryland Dental School. A native of Rhode Island, Dr. Crossley received a Bachelor of Science degree in Pharmacy from the University of Rhode Island in 1964. He later was awarded the Master of Science (1970) and Doctorate degrees (1972) in Pharmacology. The University of Maryland Dental School in Baltimore awarded Dr. Crossley the D.D.S. degree in 1980. The liaison between the classroom and his part-time dental practice produced a practical approach to understanding the pharmacology of drugs used in the dental office. Dr. Crossley has co-authored several articles and four books dealing with a variety of topics within the field of pharmacology. Other areas of expertise include the pharmacology of street drugs and chemical dependency. He serves on the Maryland State Dental Association's Well-Being Committee, is an active member of Phi Kappa Phi, Omicron Kappa Upsilon Honorary Dental Society, the American College of Dentists, International College of Dentists, and an honorary member of the Thomas B. Hinman Dental Society. He was the recipient of the 2008 Gordon Christensen Lecturer Recognition award presented by the Chicago Dental Society and the recipient of the 2012 Award of Distinction presented by the Academy of Dentistry International for his efforts in Continuing Dental Education. He has been a consultant for the United States Drug Enforcement Administration and other law enforcement agencies since 1974. Drawing on this unique background, Dr. Crossley has become nationally and internationally recognized as an expert on street drugs and chemical dependency as well as clinical pharmacology of dental drugs.





"Opioid Use, Misuse, Abuse, and Addition: Appropriate Opioid and Non-Opioid Prescribing" by Harold Crossley, DDS

Saturday, February 4, 2023

This two-hour program will discuss the addictive nature, abuse, and proper prescribing of opioids in a dental practice. For centuries opioids have been used to control pain and suffering, but at what cost to us, our families, and our dental practices? What are our alternatives for controlling post-operative pain? This lecture will satisfy the Ohio State Dental Board's requirement for opioid prescribing for the biennium ending 12/31/23 for dentists and hygienists!
